Resident Population and Age

The resident population of Alford, as measured in the 2001 Census, was 4,333 of which 48 per cent were male and 52 per cent were female. The resident population of East Lindsey was 130,447, of which 49 per cent were male and 51 per cent were female.

For the first time, the 2001 Census asked a question about any voluntary care provided to look after, or give any help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of long term physical or mental ill-health or disability, or problems relating to old age.

There are two main benefits associated with health that are paid to people needing help with personal care. They are the 'Disability Living Allowance' and the 'Attendance Allowance'.

The Disability Living Allowance is a benefit paid to people under 65, who are disabled, and need help with personal care, and/or getting around. In August 2000, 6,840 people in East Lindsey received this benefit.

The Attendance Allowance is paid to people over the age of 65, who are so severely disabled, physically or mentally, that they need supervision or a great deal of help with personal care. In May 2000, 3,265 people in East Lindsey received this benefit.

Within Alford, 29 per cent of those unemployed were aged 50 and over, 5 per cent had never worked and 30 per cent were long term unemployed.

In August 2000, there were 1,020 Jobseeker Allowance claimants in East Lindsey of which 32 per cent had child dependants. The Job Seeker Allowance (JSA) is payable to people under pensionable age who are available for, and actively seeking, work of at least 40 hours a week. Figures produced here are those only for people claiming income-based JSA.

In August 2000, there were 8,580 Income Support claimants in East Lindsey, of which 2 per cent were aged under 20. Income support was introduced on April 11th 1988 and can be paid to a person who is aged 16 and over, is not working 16 hours or more a week, and has less money coming in than the law says they need to live on.
